Charcoal Making

Thanks to our successful bid to the [Shropshire Hills AONB Conservation Fund](#), on the 22nd July we took delivery of a charcoal retort and received training in how to use it from the designer/retailer James Hookway of [Hookway Retorts](#). We have chosen to use a retort over a traditional ring kiln as it produces very little particulate pollution and converts more of the timber into charcoal. The retort was simpler to set up and use than we anticipated, which was a pleasant surprise. The retort produced practically no smoke, completed its burn by around 5pm, and was left to cool at the end of the training day. We returned to it at our next task day and found that the conversion had gone well and we had very little "brown ends" (partially converted timber). Our experimental carbonisation of fern leaves in the top of the retort has also worked well - see photos. We sold our very first bag of charcoal to a volunteer at the training!

The purchase of the retort and the training are a huge step forward, but this is only the beginning of the process. We are looking forward to demonstrating our equipment and what we have learnt to other woodland groups in the Shropshire Hills AONB this Autumn.



Castle Ring Wood Wildlife

On almost our last task day before our summer break we had a bit of a wildlife bonanza at one of the woods we work in, Castle Ring Wood. Finds included a Jay feather, some magnificent honeysuckle, a common toad, an (out-of-focus) pupa of a Magpie Moth (*Abraxas grossulariata*), a Stinkhorn fungus (*Phallus impudicus*) and an insect unknown to the author...! Hedgelaying

Covid restrictions allowing, we hope to run our hedgelaying course again this autumn – pictured is our last course. Community Woodland Gathering 2021

Llais y Goedwig have organised the annual gathering of the community woodland groups of Wales for the 17th and 18th September 2021 at Coxwood, near Wrexham. We have attended in past years and found it to be a thoroughly enjoyable event. Here is a little taste of what they have planned:



Practical workshops and demonstrations: Collecting and growing on seeds from your own trees; Making essential oils from foraged products; Willow crafts; Apple pressing; Charcoal making.

Discussions, talks and sharing ideas: Managing a woodland for diverse products; How to identify and manage Ash Dieback in your woods; Community woodlands and the National Forest.

Woodland Marketplace: Bring your own products, or information about what you offer from your woodland to show and sell - examples so far include birch sap syrup and heritage orchard cider.

Fun activities for the kids – including an adventure playpark on-site!

FREE **Reptile Survey Training** will take place online on Wednesday 15th September at 6pm, delivered by the Amphibian and Reptile Conservation Trust. This session will cover the theory of reptile ecology, surveying and fieldcraft. The first hour will be spent learning about the ecology of our four widespread Welsh species, the second will cover the insights we can gain from understanding ecology to enable us to find and observe these species in the wild.
